This is a true story. In 1892 at Stanford University, an 18-year-old student was struggling to pay his school fees. His mother and father were dead, so he didn't know where to turn for money. One day, he had ①a bright idea. He and a friend decided to hold a concert on campus to raise money for their education.

They contacted the great pianist Ignacy Jan Paderewski. His manager demanded that they pay a fee of \$2,000 for the piano concert. ②The boys agreed and ( work / a success / to / began / make / to / the concert ).

The big day arrived. Unfortunately, they could not sell enough tickets. They could get only \$1,600. They went to Paderewski and explained the situation. They gave him the \$1,600 and they (ア)[ write ] a signed letter, and promised to pay another \$400 as soon as possible.

"No," said Paderewski. "I cannot accept this." He tore up the letter, returned the \$1,600 and told the two boys, "Here's the \$1,600. Use the money to pay your school fees." The boys were ( ③ ), and thanked him a lot.
